NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF A PUBLIC PATH ORDER

The Cambridgeshire County Council (Public Bridleway No. 12, Fenstanton) Public Path Creation Order 2020

On 14 October 2020 Cambridgeshire County Council confirmed the above Order under section 26 of the Highways Act 1980. The effect of the Order as confirmed is to create a public bridleway from a junction with School Lane (public road) at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) TL 3192 6882 (Point A on the Order Map) and proceeds along a roadway, known as The Fen, in a generally north-north-easterly direction for a distance of 137 metres to a point at OSGR TL 3200 6892 (Point B). Continues along a track, known as The Fen, in a generally north-north-easterly direction for a distance of 107 metres to a point at OSGR TL 3202 6903 (Point C). Continuing along the track in a generally north-north-easterly, then north easterly direction for a distance of 206 metres to a point at OSGR TL 3211 6919 (Point E). Then continuing along the track in an east-north-easterly direction for a distance of 406 metres to a point at OSGR TL 3249 6933 (Point G). Then continuing in a north-easterly direction for 808 metres to a junction with Public Bridleway No. 21, Fenstanton at OSGR TL 3294 2700 (Point M) as shown on the Order Map.

A copy of the Order and the Order Map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at St Ives Library, 4 Library Row, Station Road, St Ives, Cambridgeshire PE27 5BW between 10am and 2pm Monday, Wednesday and Saturday and online at www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/definitivemap. Copies of the Order and Map may be bought from the undersigned at the price of £4.80 each.

The Order comes into force on 21 October 2020, but if a person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within six weeks from the date on which the Notice is published, make an application to the High Court.
