

BIRD FLU GUIDANCE



The Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs has confirmed cases of avian influenza (bird flu) in the wild bird population of Huntingdonshire, centred on the River Ouse.

The risk to human health is considered **very low, however it is vital that people do not touch sick live birds or bird carcasses.**

- **Keep to the footpath**
- **Keep dogs on leads**
- **Do not feed wild waterfowl**
- **Do not pick up or touch dead or sick wild birds**
- **Do not touch wild bird feathers or surfaces contaminated with wild bird droppings**
